

For this year 2019, The Filipino Chaplaincy of our Diocese will hold a Mass to Launch this Filipino tradition on 14 December at 7:00pm at the Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara. The various Filipino communities within our Diocese are coming together to celebrate the Holy Eucharist after which they will be sent of to their respective communities holding a "Parol" Christmas star to start the observance of this "Simbang Gabi" tradition. A light meal and entertainment follow after Mass at The Light of Christ Centre.

Here in Broken Bay, we celebrate three modes of observance. The full Novena Masses at dawn or evening (vigil) and the Triduum (three evening Masses). The **Dawn Masses** from 16-24 December at 5:30am will be hosted by the Our Lady of Dolours Filipino Community in Chatswood.

The Evening (vigil) Masses will be held at St Kevin's Church, Dee Why at 7:30pm from 15-23 December, hosted by Filcos group and other parish ethnic groups.

The Central Coast area will hold a **Triduum** at St Cecilia's Church, Wyong at 7:00pm on 20, 22 and 23 December, hosted by the East Gosford and Wyong Filipino communities.

All these Masses will be followed by light refreshments or snacks catered from food contributions of the community. All welcome.
