We are called to live simply, to be content with what we have and habitually thank God for blessings received, and to be generous and share, as responsible citizens of the world.




#### **San Rocco Feast Mass**


# Prayer for a New Bishop

For there is only one God, and there is only one mediator between God and mankind, himself a man, Christ Jesus, who sacrificed himself as a ransom for them all. He is the evidence of this, sent at the appointed time, and I have been named a herald and apostle of it and - I am telling the truth and no lie - a teacher of the faith and the truth to the pagans.

In every place, then, I want the men to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument.
