Jesus in his passion shows himself as a "wounded healer" He does not draw attention to his suffering but to the suffering of others to whom he brings healing. He weeps—but for Jerusalem. In Gethsemane he heals the severed ear of the high priest's servant. When Peter betrays him, he looks at the apostle and Peter weeps bitterly. He prays to the Father to forgive those who are responsible for his crucifixion, and he promises Paradise to the repentant thief. The face of the Crucified One is the face of Mercy.

Pope Francis has invited us to fix our eyes on the merciful gaze of Jesus. He has written that the mission Jesus received from the Father, was that of revealing the mystery of divine love in its fullness. The signs Jesus worked especially for sinners, the poor, the marginalised, the sick, and the suffering, were all meant to teach mercy. Everything in Jesus, Pope Francis reminds usspeaks of mercy. Nothing in him is devoid of compassion. In response, mercy should be foundation of the Church's life. It is Pope Francis' wish that all the Church's pastoral activity should be caught up in communicating God's tender mercy. The Church's very credibility rests on how well it reveals the merciful and compassionate face of God.




