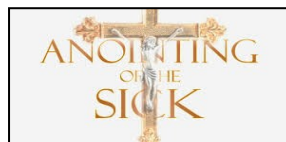

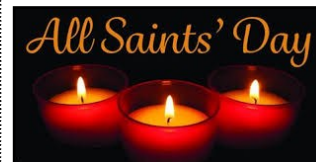

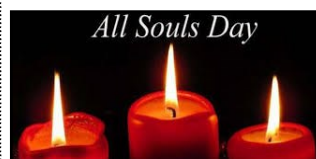

Jesus spoke the following parable to some people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else. 'Two men went up to

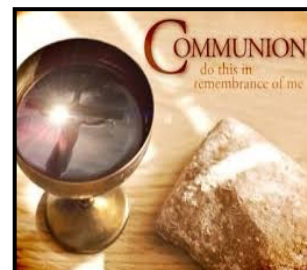
