When God suddenly confronts him with the reality of death, the rich man is exposed for what he truly is: foolish and poor. He will lose all material wealth in death and because he is also poor in the matters of the spirit, he will come empty-handed before God. Jesus says, "Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be" (Lk 12:34)

Who or what are your treasures? Do these lead you to or away from God and neighbour?



Charitable Works Fund


This weekend we are holding our Charitable Works Fund Appeal. Your donations to the Charitable Works Fund are distributed

Second Reading Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11 A reading from the letter of St Paul to Colossians.

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and, in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.

But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'
