

Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week. On Palm Sunday we remember that Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey, with crowds of people welcoming him with palms. They shouted 'Hosanna!', acknowledging God's saving presence. Yet the moment of euphoria did not last. Jesus had travelled to Jerusalem before, but this would be his



last time. He would be betrayed, tried as a criminal, and executed in the Roman way: death by crucifixion.

Easter Services Live

Easter services on Good Friday and Easter Sunday at St Mary's Cathedral will be broadcast to a national audience across the Channel 7 network. These broadcasts of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday (10th April) at 3pm and Easter Sunday Mass (12th April) at 10.30am (Sydney time) mean all people of all ages and no matter where they live will now be able to participate in the Mass when our churches are shut during the COVID-19 pandemic.



SCRIPTURE READINGS

Entrance Antiphon

Six days before the Passover, when the Lord came into the city of Jerusalem, the children ran to meet him; in their hands they carried palm branches and with a loud voice cried out: Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy! O gates, lift high your heads; grow higher, ancient doors. Let him enter, the king of glory! Who is this king of glory? He, the Lord of hosts, he is the king of glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy!

Entrance Gospel: Matthew 21:1-11

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

When they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives. Jesus sent two disciples, saving to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find an ass tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, "The Lord has need of them," and he will send them immediately'. This took place to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet, saying, 'Tell the daughter of Zion, Behold, your king is coming to you, humble and mounted on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of an ass'. The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the ass and the colt, and put their garments on them, and he sat thereon. Most of the crowd spread their garments on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. And the crowds that went before him and that followed him shouted, 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!' And when he entered Jerusalem

all the city was stirred, saying, 'Who is this?' And the crowds said, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth of Galilee'.

First Reading Isaiah 50:4-7 A reading from the prophet Isaiah The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

Responsorial Psalm

Ps 21:8-9, 17-20, 23-24 R. My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?
