

In today's Gospel, Jesus uses two domestic images, salt and light to teach the disciples how important they are in sharing his mission. Notice that Jesus uses the emphatic phrase "You are......" Not, you can be, or you might be, or maybe, you will be.

No, he is very direct in naming them as salt and light, they are change agents.

Just as salt adds flavour to food and light dispels the darkness, so will they transform the world by their witness and their good deeds.

In accepting this identity, we bring glory to God.

"Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds, and glorify your Heavenly Father"

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Entrance Antiphon

O come, Let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

Isaiah 58:7-10

A reading from the prophet Isaiah Thus says the Lord:

Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see to be naked and turn not from your own kin. Then will your light shine like the dawn and your wound be quickly healed over.

Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.


good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven.'
