Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

As we commence the season of Advent, we hear Jesus speak to us in prophetic and even somewhat frightening words. He talks of signs in the sun, moon and stars, of the heavens being shaken and the ocean in tumult, and of human beings dying of fright. In the chaotic and turbulent times in which we live, we may readily wonder if we are witnessing such signs at present. If we look at history, we realise that almost every age and era has had its fair share of trials, disasters and catastrophes. And, in a sense, they are all signs of the coming of the Son of Man. For truly, Christ comes to us not just once, but many times – or rather, he is continually coming to us. The word 'advent' literally means 'coming', and we are called upon to prepare our hearts and lives for this coming at every moment, but especially during this season. Let us guard ourselves against excessive distraction, busyness, and stress, so that when the infant Jesus arrives, he may find a serene and peaceful dwelling place ready for him in our hearts!

The Advent Season

We have begun the season of Advent. It is a significant period of spiritual preparation, reflection, and anticipation. The Latin word "adventus" means "coming." It is a fourweek period before Christmas and a time for preparing for the comings of Christ. We want to celebrate the birth of Jesus (first coming of Christ) which happened just over two thousand years ago and to anticipate his second coming when He will come again in glory to definitively establish the kingdom where we can share fully in that glory and happiness depending on how we live now under and with grace. So, the birthday of Christ uniquely celebrates both a past and future event.

In his first coming Jesus won for us infinite mercy as we come to Him with humble and contrite hearts. Without the first coming after the Fall of Adam and Eve and our subsequent wrong doing there was an infinite distance between God and ourselves and so we could never experience everlasting happiness in heaven (Bad news). But because Jesus took up our humanity, He could represent us and because He is a divine Person He could bridge the infinite gap between ourselves and God by satisfying public justice in living every virtue in the experience of his costly passion. No greater love has a person than one who lays down his life for another. Hence great gratitude is in order. We may now regain and experience God's friendship and happiness eternally (Good news).

In Advent it is appropriate for each of us to reflect on our own personal relationship with Jesus in a way that is committed to his project of loving others. It makes sense to prayerfully study the life of Jesus and habitually aim to imitate Him under grace while simultaneously saying no to impulses that are not in keeping with the Gospel and are not life-giving. There are Advent programs which you may use to help achieve the above aim. One relates to St Therese and the other is from our diocese. They are free and are not onerous. See the bulletin for details. There is also a special Advent reconciliation service at the parish on Thursday 7.30pm to 8.30pm on the 19th December. So, prayerfully decide how you might deepen your relationship with Jesus during this Advent time.

ADVENT WREATH:

This is a circular wreath with four candles which are lit, one for each week, symbolizing hope, love, joy, and peace during Advent.

First Candle: Prophets' candle who spoke of a future Messiah (Hope in his coming).

Second Candle: John the Baptist's candle who prepared the way of the Lord and calls us to repent (To repent is to love God and others).

Third Candle: Saints' Candle: We call to mind all the saints who now experience the fullness of Joy in heaven. We want to follow.


Fourth Candle: Angel Gabriel's candle who brought the message of peace through Jesus to Mary the Mother of Christ and our spiritual Mother.

Cana Market Stall: Sunday, 1 December 2024
Next Sunday, a stall will be held outside the church to support Cana Communities after the 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. Masses. The market stall will have handmade gifts, preserves, and other pantry items suitable for Christmas presents.

Cana Communities is a not-for-profit charity working with men and women, who have experienced homelessness, addiction, mental health issues, and other barriers that have prevented them from creating a positive life for themselves. At Cana Farm at Orchard Hills, locally grown and chemical-free produce is grown with the help of volunteers and community members, often people who have been homeless or are transitioning back into society following time in jail and face employment barriers.

Cana is run by volunteers and regularly runs stalls in parishes in the Sydney area. Funds raised go towards providing employment, education, and sustainable opportunities for people transforming their lives.

Sunday 1 December 2024: First Sunday of Advent

Collect

Grant your faithful, we pray, almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming, so that, gathered at his right hand, they may be worthy to possess the heavenly Kingdom.

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah Jer 33:14-16

I will cause a good seed to spring forth from David.

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I am going to fulfil the promise I made to the House of Israel and the House of Iudah:

'In those days and at that time, I will make a virtuous Branch grow for David, who shall practise honesty and integrity in the land.
