

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

There is something about the place in which today's Gospel reading is set. Jesus had just prayed all night long in the hills before appointing the twelve who were to be his apostles. He then brought them down to level ground where a crowd of his

disciples and a larger crowd of people full of self-interest awaited him. By creating a scene where all those gathered were rubbing shoulders with one another Luke was pointing out that this was Jesus really saying to the assembly: "Pay close attention, for we are all in this together."

By listing blessings and woes in four pairs, Jesus was very likely reminding his audience that they had probably found themselves in the tension of experiencing the blessings and woes one on top of the other, hoping for the blessing of comfort in the midst of hardship and struggle of all kinds followed almost immediately by the realisation that they had at times contributed to others' hardship or failed to comfort them when they were doing it tough. Haven't we all seen ourselves, from time to time, as a mixture of saint and sinner?

If we step back for a moment from the text, we might be able to see that the greatest beatitude for us is Jesus himself. He continues to be God's blessing to the weak (all of us) in a world that reserves its admiration for the wealthy, the powerful and the famous. That's a world he invites us to change.

Social Justice Corner



Anniversary of the National Apology to Stolen Generations

February 13 marked the 17th Anniversary of the National Apology to the Stolen Generations. It was a significant milestone for healing for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, who suffered as a result of past government policies of forced child removal and assimilation The grief and trauma are still felt today by survivors and their families.

As noted by the Healing Foundation this week, it is important that, as a nation, we commemorate and acknowledge the wrongs of the past, while reflecting on the work that still needs to be done. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children are still grossly over-represented at every stage of the child protection system. In 2023, across Australia 43.7% of children aged 0–217 years old in out of home care were Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander.

The Healing Foundation's report, <u>Are you waiting for us to die?' — The Unfinished Business of Bringing Them Home</u>, released this week, reported only 6% of the recommendations from the National Inquiry into the Separation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children from Their Families 1997 (the Bringing Them Home report) — to support Stolen Generations survivors and their families — have been clearly implemented. This lack of comprehensive actions illustrates a vital component of truth-telling — that it must achieve change.

As a parish, we have an important role in reflecting on our shared history and how we can renew our efforts as parish to work towards genuine reconciliation and healing.
