"What parable can we use for [the kingdom of God]? It is like a mustard seed." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Today's Gospel contains the great parable of the mustard seed. The use of parables was a masterly teaching technique of Jesus to convey truths and insights about the reign of God. Jesus used everyday realities and familiar occurrences to communicate his teaching to them.

Narrative theology is a branch of study that considers how stories in the Bible employ different genres and literary features to communicate the author's intent (albeit inspired by the Holy Spirit) and how the historical and social factors of the time may have shaped these stories. This parable of the mustard seed is a timeless little narrative that speaks to us in our days of how important it is to care for our creation.

How can we plant seeds of hope in all the situations we will encounter this day? What stands out for you as you read this Gospel parable? How does it relate to your experiences at this very moment?





### Sunday 16 June 2024: Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Collect

O God, strength of those who hope in you, graciously hear our pleas,

and, since without you mortal frailty can do nothing,

grant us always the help of your grace, that in following your commands we may please you by our resolve and our deeds.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

### First Reading

From the prophet Ezekiel Ez 17:22-24

I have made the small tree great.

The Lord says this:

'From the top of the cedar,

from the highest branch I will take a shoot and plant it myself on a very high mountain. I will plant it on the high mountain of Israel. It will sprout branches and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar.

Every kind of bird will live beneath it, every winged creature rest in the shade of its branches.

And every tree of the field will learn that I, the Lord, am the one

who stunts tall trees and makes the low ones grow,

who withers green trees and makes the withered green.

I, the Lord, have spoken, and I will do it.'

# **Responsorial Psalm** Ps 91:2-3. 13-16. R. see v.2

((R.) Lord, it is good to give thanks to you.

- 1. It is good to give thanks to the Lord to make music to your name, O Most High, to proclaim your love in the morning and your truth in the watches of the night. (R.)
- 2. The just will flourish like the palm-tree and grow like a Lebanon cedar. (R.)

### Second Reading

From the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 2 Cor 5:6-10

Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing the Lord.

We are always full of confidence when we remember that to live in the body means to be exiled from the Lord, going as we do by faith and not by sight – we are full of confidence, I say, and actually want to be exiled from the body and make our home with the Lord. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing him. For all the truth about us will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he deserves for the things he did in the body, good or bad.

### Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 4:26-34

The mustard seed, the smallest of all the seeds, grows into the biggest shrub of all.

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
