"While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them ." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Today the Church celebrates the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (or Corpus Christi as it was known). This feast day not only provides an opportunity to renew our devotion in the Blessed Sacrament but also to deepen our understanding of what Eucharist means. The word Eucharist comes from the Greek term meaning, 'thanksgiving'. We believe that in the consecrated bread and wine of the Eucharist, Christ is really present. *We will honour this presence in a special procession in the Church towards the end of the 10am mass, followed by a community sausage sizzle.*

In Mark's Gospel today, Jesus takes bread and wine and says that the new 'covenant' is his body and blood poured out and shared. The body of Christ is also present in the community gathered in prayer, and in the suffering of people who are being persecuted; in the proclamation of God's Word and in the unexpected and surprising moments of every passing day. On this traditional feast day, how can we broaden our understanding of the meaning of consuming and sharing the Eucharist? How can we be a Eucharistic presence for the people we encounter, and in the busyness and quietness of each day?

You are warmly invited to attend a film night and fundraising screening of the documentary LIMBO on Friday, June 21st, at Moore Park. The John Mac Foundation (JMF), a charity working to educate and empower refugees and people whose lives have been interrupted by war, is hosting the event.

Established in 2016, JMF aims to remove some of the barriers to education and access to meaningful employment for refugees in Australia. The foundation provides scholarships to those from refugee and humanitarian backgrounds, opportunities to help scholars transition to meaningful employment in their chosen field and mentoring by connecting scholars with career advice. Nominated for two BAFTA® awards for Best British Film and Best Debut by a British Writer, Director or Producer, LIMBO is a wry and poignant observation of the refugee experience, set on a fictional remote Scottish island where a group of new arrivals await the results of their asylum claims. It centres on Omar, a young Syrian musician who is burdened by his grandfather's oud, which he



has carried all the way from his homeland.

The Word

Sunday 2 June 2024: The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Collect

God our Father, who by sending into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification made known to the human race your wondrous mystery,

grant us, we pray, that in professing the true faith, we may acknowledge the Trinity of eternal glory and adore your Unity, powerful in majesty. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,

who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

From the Acts of the book of Exodus Ex 24:3-8

This is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you.

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standingstones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. 'This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

Responsorial Psalm Ps 115:12-13. 15-18. R. v.13

(R.) I will take the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord.

- 1. How can I repay the Lord for his goodness to me? The cup of salvation I will raise; I will call on the Lord's name. (*R*.)
- 2. O precious in the eyes of the Lord is the death of his faithful. Your servant, Lord, your servant am I; you have loosened my bonds. (*R.*)
- 3. A thanksgiving sacrifice I make: I will call on the Lord's name. My vows to the Lord I will fulfil before all his people. (*R.*)

Second Reading

From the letter to the Hebrews Heb 9:11-15

The blood of Christ will purify our inner selves.

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

This is my body. This is my blood.

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.' After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives. The Gospel of the Lord.
