Parish Choir Rehearsals




We are very close to

Social Justice Corner

The Carol Loved the World Over

Silent Night, the perennial favourite Christmas carol, had very humble beginnings. In 1816, Fr Joseph Mohr, a young Austrian Catholic priest, wrote the poem *Stille Nacht* at Mariapfarr, just after the end of the Napoleonic Wars. Shortly after, Fr Mohr moved to Oberndorf, Salzburg.

On Christmas Eve 1818, Fr Mohr asked Franz Xaver Gruber, the local schoolmaster and parish organist, to compose a melody and guitar accompaniment for that night's Mass after flooding had damaged the church organ. Remarkably, Franz Gruber composed the Stille Nacht melody for Mohr in just a few hours. The carol *Stille Nacht Heilige Nacht* was performed that evening by Fr Mohr and Franz Gruber in front of a traditional nativity scene in the church of St Nikolaas.

The carol's fundamental message of peace, even amidst suffering, became the most popular Christmas carol in the world, building bridges across cultures and generations. It is remembered for its part in the 1914 Christmas Eve truce on the front lines in Flanders when soldiers on both sides laid down their weapons, sang carols, exchanged simple gifts, and played soccer in no man's land. Although the truce was never formally declared, it was a moment of peace in a war that was still so young and had no victory in sight.

In 2011, UNESCO declared Silent Night an "intangible cultural heritage," and in Austria, *Stille Nacht* is considered a national treasure and may not be played publicly before Christmas Eve. Over 200 years after the carol was first performed in a little church in Salzburg, the lilting melody and peaceful lyrics continue to remind us of a universal sense of grace that unites people across diverse cultures and faiths.

Collect

Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts, that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ your Son

First Reading

A reading from the prophet Micah Mi 5:1-4

Out of you will be born the one who is to rule over Israel.

The Lord says this:
You, Bethlehem Ephrathah,
the least of the clans of Judah,
out of you will be born for me
the one who is to rule over Israel;
his origin goes back to the distant past,
to the days of old.

The Lord is therefore going to abandon them till the time when she who is to give birth gives birth.

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.
