Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Jesus' directive to love our enemies is ignored more often than observed. We gossip about family feuds and boast that we'll never be able to forgive so-and-so for the harm they did to us half a lifetime ago. Jesus knew that kind of thing from growing up in a tiny village. Yet, he still insisted that following him required forgiving our enemies. Just a few years ago, a mother who lost three of her own children and a young niece when they were hit by a car driven by a drunken driver in suburban Sydney said publicly: "I think in my heart to forgive him...I'm not going to hate him because that's not who we are." We hear the same kind of thing in the Bible story of Joseph, who found it within his heart to encourage the brothers who had sold him into slavery to let go of the past and to break free of the guilt that had captured them. When we can imitate Joseph and that mother, we have made a giant step towards restoring life to ourselves and to those we have forgiven.

#### World Social Justice Day



## Bio of a Catechist Dora Chan

#### Who Am I?

I live in Turramurra and work part time at the Law Society of NSW. I do voluntary work as a catechist with the Corpus Christi St Ives Parish and also with the Justice and Peace Office of Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney.

#### Family

I was born and educated in Hong Kong. My family relocated from Hong Kong to Sydney in 2020 (Patrick, my husband and my two sons, Colin and Felix). Sydney is not new to me because I previously worked and lived in Sydney from 1994 to 1997 under an exchange program with my previous employer. I returned to Hong Kong in 1997 after the exchange but I always felt I would return to Sydney sometime. My boys had studied in a boarding school in Sydney since Year 10. We relocated to Sydney to join our boys in 2020 so that our family can finally be together under one roof.

#### How long have you been a catechist?

I have been a catechist teacher with the Corpus Christi Parish, St Ives since 2021. I have taught in North Turramurra Public School and St Ives North Public School. I have taught Year 1, 2 and Year 5 classes.

### What brought you to being a catechist!

I had been doing Sunday School teaching (similar to catechist teaching in Australia but it was on a parish basis on Sundays before or after mass) in Hong Kong for quite a long time. I enjoy the Sunday School teaching and I wanted to continue with that in Sydney. I would like to spread the good news to children which Jesus has asked us to do in the Bible. I feel this is especially important to students in public schools where their normal curriculum does not have a faith element. It would be a great loss for our children if we do not make good use of the SRE lesson to nurture and develop the Catholic faith in students of public schools. During my teaching of SRE lessons, I found it sad to learn some families of the SRE students do not go to church regularly. I hope the SRE lessons can help the students to ignite their interest in learning more about the Catholic faith, the Bible and divine love that

Jesus has for all of us and eventually kindle a closer connection with these families to the Church.

#### Why do you stay?

To be able to help the students to learn more about the Bible, the Catholic faith and that Jesus loves us dearly, is a privilege and blessing to me. I have great satisfaction in being a catechist.

# What would you say to someone considering being a catechist?

Give it a go and you may not realise how fulfilling and enjoyable it can be. There are good supporting materials and PowerPoints compiled by the Diocese and it is not difficult to prepare for and teach a lesson. The joy and pleasure that a child comes up to you and tell you that they learn how to pray and talk to God from your SRE lesson is a such a gratifying experience which is beyond words. We need more catechist to do this meaningful work and I hope you can be one of them.

#### **WHY WE DO**

### The Things We Do

#### First things first

The initial part of the Mass (the Introductory Rites) is an important time of gathering and preparation. The entrance song helps to open the celebration, unit us as a body and lead our thoughts towards the mystery of God's love which we have come to celebrate. The priest's greeting ('The Lord be with you') and the congregation's response ('And also with you') affirms that Christ is present in our midst. This is a time for focusing on the importance of the opportunity for worship that lies before us.

#### PLEASE KEEP THE POPE IN YOUR PRAYERS Excerpt from Vox Populi - Office of the Bishop

The Holy Father has been in hospital for the past several days, suffering with pneumonia in both lungs.

The entire Church joins in prayer for the Holy Father, praying for his recovery, and hopeful he will soon return to serving the People of God.

It is fitting that on Saturday, the Church will celebrate the Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter, honouring the supremacy of Saint Peter and all his successors, the Bishops of Rome.

It represents an apt time to elevate our prayers for the health of the Holy Father, who sits on the Chair of Saint Peter, as the Vicar of Christ.

The feast is an ancient one, having been celebrated as early as the 4<sup>th</sup> century. The person who sits on the Chair of Saint Peter has been a universal sign of unity and communion within the Church since the first century. "[Jesus Christ] placed Blessed Peter over the other apostles, and instituted in him a permanent and visible source and foundation of unity of faith and communion." (Lumen Gentium 18)

It's a reminder the power of Christ rests not on the person, but in his office, and that the authority given to Saint Peter by Christ, also rests with his successor.

#### Sunday 23 February 2025: Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Collect

Grant, we pray, almighty God,
that, always pondering spiritual things,
we may carry out in both word and deed

#### First Reading

From the first book of Samuel 1 Sm 26:2. 7-9. 12-13. 22-23

The Lord has put you in my power, but I will not raise my hand against you.

Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph. So in the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him. Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice. David answered Abishai, Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without quilt?' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them.

David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. David then called out, 'Here is the king's spear. Let one of the soldiers come across and take it. The Lord repays everyone for his uprightness and loyalty. Today the Lord put you in my power, but I would not raise my hand against the Lord's anointed.'

To the man who slaps you on one cheek, present the other cheek too; to the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. Give to everyone who asks you, and do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you. Treat others as you would like them to treat you. If you love those who love you, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what thanks can you expect? For even sinners do that much. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners lend to sinners to get back the same amount. Instead, love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. 'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.
