

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The readings for this midway point in Lent speak to us of the all-pervading presence of the divine. God's name, revealed in the first reading from the book of Exodus, is totally identified with divine being. God's existence is revealed in all that is. St Mary McKillip expressed this in her insightful words, 'wherever you are, God is'. The psalmist describes the nature of such divine being as 'compassion and love, slow to anger and rich in mercy.'

The parable of the barren fig tree reminds us that God is patient and waiting for us to bear fruit from the divine giftedness planted within us. It is a parable which calls us to realise that God's grace is faithfully nurtured in us by tilling the soil of our lives. We are called to respond to this divine care and generosity by going forth and bearing fruit through our love and generosity to all we encounter.

Social Justice Corner

Close The Gap Day (20 March 2025)

Close the Gap is a social justice "peoples" campaign that was launched in April 2007 following Professor Tom Calma's 2005 Social Justice report which emphasised health as a human right and challenged governments to bring about health equality within a generation.

The Close the Gap Campaign began National Close the Gap Day (NCTGD) to give opportunity to communities, businesses and schools around Australia the opportunity to stand with First Australians in demanding health equality for all.

National Close the Gap Day reminds us there is still a long way to go until we achieve equity in health and life expectancy for Aboriginal people. In Australia, Aboriginal infants continue to die more often than non-Indigenous infants and Aboriginal people's life expectancy is shorter, with more than double the rate of illness.

Closing the gap requires us to actively address the inequities that Aboriginal people and communities have experienced, and continue to experience, because of racism, government policy, and other acts of marginalisation. Australia must ensure genuine

partnerships with Aboriginal people,





The Word

Sunday 23 March 2025: Third Sunday of Lent

Collect

O'God, author of every mercy and of all goodness, who in fasting, prayer and almsgiving have shown us a remedy for sin, look graciously on this confession of our lowliness, that we, who are bowed down by our conscience, may always be lifted up by your mercy. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, you Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

From the book of Exodus Ex 3:1-8. 13-15

This is what you must say to the children of Israel: I Am has sent me to you.

Moses was looking after the flock of Jethro, his fatherin-law, priest of Midian. He led his flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in the shape of a flame of fire, coming from the middle of a bush. Moses looked; there was the bush blazing but it was not being burnt up. 'I must go and look at this strange sight,' Moses said, 'and see why the bush is not burnt.' Now the Lord saw him go forward to look, and God called to him from the middle of the bush. 'Moses, Moses!' he said. 'Here I am' he answered. 'Come no nearer' he said. 'Take off your shoes, for the place on which you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your father,' he said 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.' At this Moses covered his face, afraid to look at God. And the Lord said, 'I have seen the miserable state of my people in Egypt. I have heard their appeal to be free of their slave-drivers. Yes, I am well aware of their sufferings. I mean to deliver them out of the hands of the Egyptians and bring them up out of that land to a land rich and broad, a land where milk and honey flow.' Then Moses said to God, 'I am to go, then, to the sons of Israel and say to them, "The God of your fathers has sent me to you." But if they ask me what his name is, what am I to tell them?' And God said to Moses, 'I Am who I Am. This' he added 'is what you must say to the sons of Israel: "The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you." This is my name for all time; by this name I shall be invoked for all generations to come.'

Second Reading

From the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 1 Cor 10:1-6, 10-12

All this that happened to the people of Moses in the desert was written for our benefit.

I want to remind you how our fathers were all guided by a cloud above them and how they all passed through the sea. They were all baptised into Moses in this cloud and in this sea; all ate the same spiritual food and all drank the same spiritual drink, since they all drank from the spiritual rock that followed them as they went, and that rock was Christ. In spite of this, most of them failed to please God and their corpses littered the desert. These things all happened as warnings for us, not to have the wicked lusts for forbidden things that they had. You must never complain: some of them did, and they were killed by the Destroyer. All this happened to them as a warning and it was written down to be a lesson for us who are living at the end of the age. The man who thinks he is safe must be careful that he does not fall. The Word of the Lord.

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 13:1-9

Unless you repent you will all perish as they did. Some people arrived and told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with that of their sacrifices. At this he said to them, 'Do you suppose these Galileans who suffered like that were greater sinners than any other Galileans? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen on whom the tower at Siloam fell and killed them? Do you suppose that they were more guilty than all the other people living in Jerusalem? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did.'

He told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came looking for fruit on it but found none. He said to the man who looked after the vineyard, "Look here, for three years now I have been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and finding none. Cut it down: why should it be taking up the ground?" "Sir," the man replied "leave it one more year and give me time to dig round it and manure it: it may bear fruit next year; if not, then you can cut it down."
