"You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Our first reading today is taken from the Book of Daniel. We can describe Daniel as one of the great visionaries in the Bible. As Daniel tells us in the first reading today, "I gazed into the visions of the night, and I saw..." What a powerful statement that is! And what did he see? He saw Christ the King. As he said, "I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man... On him was conferred sovereignty, glory, kingship, and men and women from all peoples, nations and languages served him. His sovereignty is an eternal sovereignty, which shall never pass away, nor will his empire ever be destroued.

If Daniel is the great visionary in the Bible, then Pontius Pilate, whom we meet in today's Gospel, is the Bible's great cynic – he has no vision at all, and he believes in nothing. The king of the Jews is standing before him and he cannot recognise him. And when Jesus says that his kingdom is a kingdom of truth, Pilate utters the ultimate cynical statement: "Truth! What is that?" Pilate no longer believes in the transcendental values of truth, goodness, beauty and altruism. He is motivated purely by self-interest, taking no responsibility for his actions (indeed, washing his hands clean of them).

Occasionally we meet cynics who only have bad things to say about the world and the Church and faith. What we most need our visionaries, people who don't deny that much is wrong, but still manage to see the good. Let us ask Christ our King to open our eyes that, amid the challenges, self-interest and scepticism that abound, we may see the signs of his presence among us in the goodness, the kindness and the self-sacrifice of so many people.

We are about to enter the "time" of "Advent" but what do we know about this beautiful "little season" which begins the Liturgical Year?



Cana Market Stall: Sunday, 1 December 2024
Next Sunday, a stall will be held outside the church to support Cana Communities after the 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. Masses. The market stall will have handmade gifts, preserves, and other pantry items suitable for Christmas presents.

Cana Communities is a not-for-profit charity working with men and women, who have experienced homelessness, addiction, mental health issues, and other barriers that have prevented them from creating a positive life for themselves. At Cana Farm at Orchard Hills, locally grown and chemical-free produce is grown with the help of volunteers and community members, often people who have been homeless or are transitioning back into society following time in jail and face employment barriers.

Cana is run by volunteers and regularly runs stalls in parishes in the Sydney area. Funds raised go towards providing employment, education, and sustainable opportunities for people transforming their lives.

PC ITEMS


We would like to thank those generous parishioners who have already made donation contributions towards the purchase of the PC items.


To date approximately \$22,300 has been either paid or pledged to this appeal, which will reduce the total amount of the building contract.

We would like to share some photos of the roof timbers to show why it was important to replace the roof. As you will see from the photos there were a number of rotting timbers and some were badly cracked. New timbers were installed in various places in the roof to make sure the



roof was stable and would last for many years. The new timbers are a different colour to the existing timbers.
