## Feast of the Conversion of St Paul



On Saturday we celebrated the Feast of the Conversion of St Paul, the great evangelist driven by passion and love for Christ and His Church.

Saul of Tarsus, as he was known was a Diaspora Jew, a member of the party of the Pharisees, who turned away from persecution of Christians when he was suddenly and dramatically converted on the road to Damascus in the early first century A.D. when Our Lord appeared to him in His resurrected glory. Paul went on to become a great and widely-travelled missionary throughout the eastern Roman Empire spreading the Gospel and being the first to preach to Gentiles that they could be saved by their faith in God and not be good deeds or works of the law. He established more than a dozen churches but also endured numerous trials - beaten, stoned and shipwrecked three times before he was martyred in Rome around 64 A.D.

St Paul is traditionally considered the author of up to 13 books of the Bible, certainly seven authenticated, and more than any other biblical writer – one reason he is the patron saint of the missions, writers, and publishers.

If St Paul was alive today he would use all means of communications to bring the Word of God to all souls.

## Sunday 26 January 2025: Australia Day

#### First Reading

From the prophet Isaiah Is 32:15-18

The effect of justice will be peace.

Once more there will be poured on us the spirit from above;

then shall the wilderness be fertile land and fertile land become forest. In the wilderness justice will come to live and integrity in the fertile land; integrity will bring peace, justice give lasting security. My people will live in a peaceful home, in safe houses, in quiet dwellings. The Word of the Lord.

#### Second Reading

From the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 1 Cor 12:14-11

One and the same Spirit distributes different gifts as he chooses.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always the same Lord: working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given him by the Spirit; another may have the gift of preaching instruction given him by the same Spirit; and another the gift of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through this one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophecy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, who distributes different gifts to different people just as he chooses. The Word of the Lord.
