Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The Feast of the Holy Trinity is a wonderful opportunity to celebrate. Speaking on Trinity Sunday. Pope Francis said that celebrating the Trinity is 'not so much a theological exercise, but a revolution in our way of life. God, in whom each person lives for the other in a continual relationship, in continual rapport, not for themselves, provokes us to live with others and for others.' The famous Russian Icon of the Holy Trinity, from the hand of Rublev, depicts three figures at a table. The genius of the Icon is that there is room for us at the table. A translation by J.B. Philips of today's second reading emphasises this: '... you have been adopted into the very family circle of God... If we are God's children we share God's treasures...' Today's feast is an invitation to contemplate having a seat at the table...being refreshed and renewed, and hearing a call to mission. As you sit at the table with the Trinity listen to their conversation as they look at our world. What do you want to say? What do you sense is being asked of you?

First Reading

From the Acts of the book of Deuteronomy Dt 4:32-34. 39-40

The Lord himself is God in heaven above and on earth below: there is no other.

Moses said to the people: 'Put this question to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors - all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt? 'Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: The Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other.
