Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Jesus was always concerned for the human needs of people as well as the spiritual. In today's Gospel he knows that the people have nothing to eat and he is anxious to remedy that. In other episodes we see him healing the sick, comforting the grieving, reaching out to the lost and outcast, to sinners. In the prayer he taught us, he urged us to ask the Father to 'give us this day our daily bread'. This bread can refer to himself, the Bread of Life, that we receive in Communion, but it also refers to the food we need for sustenance each day.

In this Gospel we also note the concern of Jesus at none of the food gets wasted as he urges the disciples to collect all of the scraps left over. Today we live in an age of incredible wastefulness, a throwaway society. Huge amounts of food are dumped every day. Today is a good day to consider our use of the resources of the earth. One of the paradoxes of life is how a little can go a long way, as the boy with the five barley loaves and two fish demonstrates, while excess often leads to waste and leaves many hungry.

PRESBYTERY UPDATE

Dear Parishioners

Thank you to the volunteers who have assisted our wonderful office staff and Fr Greg to move the books, records, furniture and other equipment out of the presbytery. It is really appreciated.

There was a lot of culling that was necessary and some donations to Vinnies. The items being kept have been stored in the two storage containers in the car park.

The contract with the successful tenderer has now been signed by the Diocese and the contractor is ready to start this week.

Temporary office accommodation, until the new office building is built, will be in the hall, once the mould has been removed from the ceiling and the ceiling repainted. The most practical and cost effective solution for the temporary accommodation is to partition off part of the hall and have a large open plan office for the parish priest and the staff. We did consider a number of other options including a demountable office building but came to the conclusion that in the short to medium term the hall partitioning was the most practical. There were various reasons for not considering the demountable and further explanation will be given in the next update, probably next week. Briefly, the challenges include the location for a demountable office, the need for a DA, potential lack of toilet and kitchen facilities and cost of ramps for disabled access. The town planner who is advising us on this has just come out of hospital and will provide further detail such as Council regulations and DA requirements.

We are pleased to say that the quote received from the contractor was very competitive and we received good references for that contractor from another parish priest who has had a lot of work done by that contractor. The Diocese has reviewed the quote and the contract and is satisfied that we received a competitive quote. The total cost of refurbishing the presbytery, including doing the hall ceiling and the hall partitions, as well as the fees paid to various consultants, came in at just on \$520,000. This includes supply of the PC items (eg, cooktop, oven, toilets etc), some of which are being donated by generous parishioners. This will reduce the contract price. With the Diocese contribution we have sufficient funds to complete this work.

As the Diocese contribution will only be available after we have spent the funds we have raised through the very kind donations already made we believe that we will have approximately \$110,000 still to be claimed from the Diocese that will go towards funding the new parish office. This is calculated as follows:

Funds donated so far	\$380,000
Diocese contribution	\$140,000
Total for refurbishment	\$520,000

The amount that will still be contributed by the Diocese is therefore \$110,000 provided we can raise at least another \$120,000. This means that if we reach our minimum target of \$500,000 we will have \$230,000 to put towards the new office building (that is, \$110,000 from the Diocese and \$120,00 from donations).

We are now discussing the options for the new office building and a further update in this regard will be made soon. It is likely that we will need to considerably exceed the initial \$500,000 fundraising goal to be able to realise this project. In recent times parish expenses have exceeded revenue which precludes us being able to borrow the money required.

PRESBYTERY UPDATE (continued)

While we have a definite plan for the future for the administrative building it is not set in concrete. We will again present this to you and invite your comments and suggestions. It is difficult to say exactly when this will begin because of the need to raise extra funds which need to be procured before we can begin. However, as you know we do have the funds for the presbytery and the temporary office. This needs to happen now to have the presbytery ready by December 2024 as the tenancy for the priests' rented accommodation ceases then, concomitant with that is the need to provide for the office staff in the intermediate period.

Thank you for your generous donations and patience with this complicated project.





PRESBYTERY BUILDING PROJECT FUNDRAISING



THIS SUNDAY IS WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

In 2022, Pope Francis instituted the Churchwide celebration of World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, to be held on the fourth Sunday of July each year, close to the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

Cardinal Farrell, Prefect of the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, pointed out that "this is the first fruits of the *Amoris Laetitia Family* Year, a gift to the whole Church that is destined to continue into the future. The pastoral care of the elderly is a priority that can no longer be postponed by any Christian community. In the encyclical *Fratelli Tutti*, the Holy Father reminds us that no one is saved alone. 

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to John Jn 6:1-15

He distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted.

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee - or of Tiberias - and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover. Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.
