"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind ..." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The great commandment given by God to Israel begins with the words: "Listen, Israel." The word 'listen' is very important. We can only love God with all our heart and our neighbour as ourselves if we are willing to listen deeply to the voice of God and the cry of our neighbour.

The conversation between Jesus and the scribe in today's Gospel is an encounter of deep listening. Each listens to what the other is saying. The scribe asks Jesus: "Which is the first of all the commandments?" He listens closely to Jesus' reply and acknowledges the truthfulness of Jesus' words. At the end, Jesus praises him saying: "You are not far from the kingdom of God."

The greatest respect, indeed, love, that we can show to anyone is to listen to what they are saying, to listen with humility and patience, to listen with the ears of our hearts, to take the risk of allowing what the other person is saying to change us in some way. Perhaps a good resolution for this week is to listen deeply to what one person is saying to us, perhaps a very familiar voice that we can hear all the time and pay attention to only rarely. This week, let us seek to listen deeply to that person with the ears of our hearts.

# NOVEMBER IS A SPECIAL MONTH WHEN WE REMEMBER OUR DEPARTED LOVED ONES

Scripture says it is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for our departed beloved ones. Because of Jesus Christ, forgiveness and love crosses the grave. We may pray for them but they cannot pray for themselves. However, they can and will pray for us. I know of parents who had a six year old boy who had big behavioural problems. They tried counselling, which is a good thing to do, but to no avail. It turned out that the mother had a miscarriage. They had a mass said for the miscarried child and the behavioural difficulties of the living child were healed.

In terms of responding for your departed beloved ones, you may write the names in a special book we will have available. You may also have a special individual mass said for the person by writing the name of the person on the envelopes found in the foyer and put a small donation in it, which can be put in the collection bowl or handed in at the sacristy. There will also be candles that you may light up. At each Sunday mass we will remember your departed ones generally as well. Remember that forgiveness and love crosses the grave through Jesus Christ.

This Sunday the Catenians will remember their departed beloved members and/or spouses in a special way at the 10am mass.

#### Seeking Peace in a Violent World



On the first anniversary of the horrifying Hamas attack on Israeli kibbutzim, Pope Francis issued a letter to Catholics of the Middle East. In the letter, he acknowledged that much blood and many tears have been shed in the last year, particularly in Gaza. He expressed his solidarity with the people of Gaza at a time when they suffer in so many ways. The Pope's announcement that the Ukrainian Catholic Bishop Mykola Bychok, whose eparchy is based in Melbourne, would be made a Cardinal in December also reminds us of the great suffering and loss by both sides since Russia invaded Ukraine in 2022.

Along with the many other conflicts worldwide, these wars re-emphasise our call to be witnesses and agents of peace in our violent world, as Australia's Bishops wrote in their 2024 – 2025 Social Justice Statement, Truth and Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World.



We would like to thank those generous parishioners who have already made donation contributions towards the purchase of the PC items.


To date approximately \$21,800 has been either paid or pledged to this appeal, which will reduce the total amount of the building contract.



#### Sunday 3 November 2024: 31st Sunday of Ordinary Time

#### Collect

Almighty and merciful God, by whose gift your faithful offer you right and praiseworthy service, grant, we pray, that we may hasten without stumbling to receive the things you have promised. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

God, for ever and ever.

#### First Reading

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy Dt 6:2-

Hear Israel, you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart.

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow.

'Listen, Israel: The Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.'

#### **Second Reading**

From the letter to the Hebrews Heb 7:23-28

This one, because he remains for ever, has an eternal priesthood.

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him. To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

From the holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 12:28-34

This is the first commandment, and the second is similar to it.

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord you God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him anymore.
