Interview with Georg Eberl, Holy Family Parish Vinnies President and Ray Donaldson, Parish Site Manager

How do you select which families are to receive hampers?



Georg: "We focus on the most vulnerable families. With care and respect, we call those receiving hampers our patrons. These are families truly struggling to make ends meet. Holy Family is a very large Parish, and most people don't know that we actually cover over 13 individual suburbs."

How do you identify those in real need?

Georg: "Our community is our eyes and ears. It might be particular families whose children attend our primary school, it could be parishioners that we know who are truly struggling, it might be our Vinnies team through providing home visits identifies those in true need. In addition, there are many programs and agencies where volunteers are active within the parish and our community who let us know of families in need as well as those we see through our Vinnies assistance line."

Tell me about the people who receive the hampers?

Ray: "We have a range of families that we support. These families run from individuals through to families with 2 parents and 10 children - so that there is a lot of kids to be looked after. The average family is two adults and three kids with most living in Housing Commission accommodation though some pay rent to private landlords."

Georg:" These families often have little or no income, making Christmas a time of stress. They work hard to provide for their children but are stretched to the limit. Hampers bring them hope and joy. With little cash the cost of food can push them into debt. We often hear quote from our patrons "I didn't know that the help was here for me"."

Ray: "In many instances there are grandparents trying to look after their grandkids. We have many large families who are patrons – Pacific Islanders and over 15% of those who receive hampers are First Nations people. Our goal is to make sure that there is adequate food for the family so they can enjoy the Christmas spirit. For our patrons, hampers mean more than food—they lift spirits."

What happens after the truck loaded with hampers leaves Corpus Christi?

Ray: "When the truck arrives at Holy Family parish all of your hampers are placed on tables around our Parish Hall, we have prepared a vetted list of those families in need. This list continues to grow each year as employment insecurity, housing insecurity and food insecurity mount. "Our volunteer team then starts the matching process so that we can plan to allocate the hampers."

How are the hampers distributed?

Ray: "In the days immediately leading up to Christmas we make available times in the morning and afternoon for patrons to pick up their hampers from the Parish Hall and for those where it's not possible to come and collect we then have special distribution runs across all of the suburbs in the parish to individual households."

What is your message to the parishioners of Corpus Christi?

Ray: "Over many years your parish has been especially generous to those who are in real need in our parish. You're well wrapped presents and the personal notes that are written to our patrons, especially your kids preparing cards for our kids, bring a strong personal touch to those that receive them. It is very much appreciated."

Georg: "Your hampers and the cash donations last year provided 150 hamper equivalents to Holy Family parish patrons. With an average of five family members this means over 750 individuals have benefited from the generosity of your parish. Your hampers are an act of God's providence. When you prepare and give these hampers, you embody the Vinnies logo: the hand of Christ blessing, the hand of love offering, and the hand of need receiving. Thank you for being the hands of Christ in our community."

"From all of us at Holy Family Parish, thank you and God bless."

The Word Sunday 8 December 2024: Second Sunday of Advent

Collect

Almighty and merciful God, may no earthly undertaking hinder those who set out in haste to meet your Son, but may our learning of heavenly wisdom gain us admittance to his company. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

A reading from the prophet Baruch Bar 5:1-9

Jerusalem – *God will show you splendour.* Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress,

put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'.

Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east:

and tarn your cycle to the basic see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them.

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 3:1-6

All people shall see the salvation of God. In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness; Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.
