Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

There are many stories about Jesus healing someone in need. Today a deaf man with a speech impediment is bought to Jesus. How blessed that man was to have friends who wanted the best for him! I am reminded of a cousin who was born unable to hear or speak but, because his parents understood the value of early childhood intervention, he was given the best possible start in life. He developed various forms of communication that in time enabled him to support himself through work, qualify as a sporting umpire and travel the world.

Sometimes we just need others to enable us to be the best we can be. Jesus gave the deaf man his full attention – he took him aside in private and by word and action opened him to a new way of living. Further he didn't want the deaf man to tell others about him because he wanted all the attention to be on the man's wellbeing rather than on himself. Jesus does all things well and gives the man hope for the future. Have there been moments in my life where I have led others to freedom because I have enabled them to see and feel the power of God? Or perhaps someone has led me? This could be a valuable reflection for today.

## Social Justice Corner

## **Child Protection Week**

At the launch of National Child Protection Week, the National Children's Commissioner Anne Hollonds reminded us that the future for thousands of Australian children is bleak because their human rights to safety, care, and protection are not a priority. Commissioner Hollonds said:

"It was a privilege to speak at the launch of National Child Protection Week today, but I did so with a very heavy heart. A second child has died in youth detention in less than a year.

"This devastating death of a child in the care of the state reminds us of all the other children who are also suffering every day because of the failure of Australian governments to honour our promise to protect the human rights of our children. Australia ratified the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child in 1990 but has failed to embed its principles into domestic laws.

"Thousands of children each year are failed by inadequate support from health, education and social service systems, resulting in the child protection and child justice systems being chronically overwhelmed. The basic needs of Australia's most vulnerable children – such as housing, enough food to eat, education and health care - are not being met.

"In a rich and developed country, these are preventable problems of our own making. These children are falling through the gaps created by our neglect and governments' lack of action based on decades of evidence."

Commissioner Hollonds made an urgent plea to the Prime Minister and leaders of all governments across Australia to look closely at the evidence in the report <u>Help Way Earlier!</u> <u>How Australia can transform child justice to improve safety and wellbeing.</u> The report outlines a reform strategy – guided by evidence – to address the needs of vulnerable children and their families and help prevent children from offending and keep the community safer.




Calling all kids!! Do you want to have a run and play after sitting still during mass? Come to Pray and Play!! We will be

## Sunday 8 September 2024: 23rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

#### Collect

O God, by whom we are redeemed and receive adoption, look graciously upon your beloved sons and daughters, that those who believe in Christ may receive true freedom and an everlasting inheritance. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

### First Reading

From the prophet Isaiah Is 35:4-7

Then the ears of the deaf shall be opened and the tongues of the dumb speak. Say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened. the ears of the deaf unsealed. then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy; for water gushes in the desert, streams in the wasteland, the scorched earth becomes a lake, the parched land springs of water.

## Second Reading

From the letter of St James Jas 2:1-5

Has not God chosen the poor of the world to inherit the kingdom?

My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people. Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed man, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats'; then you tell the poor man, 'Stand over there' or 'You can sit on the floor by my foot-rest.' Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that? Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.

### Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 7:31-37

He makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak. Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'
