The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish.

The Gospel for the first Sunday in Lent recounts Jesus alone in a stark desert landscape. He personifies the journey of his own people, the Israelites, who were tested in the desert yet, unlike Jesus, they often failed. The three temptations that Jesus received, while different in context, all relate to compromising his mission. There is an inherent subtlety at play as each lure has a certain attraction. Satan, the tempter, proposes seemingly good alternative choices to Jesus.

The desert encounter testifies to the humanity of Jesus. It is an inevitable part of being human to struggle with the spirits of both light and darkness. The human heart is not neutral territory but instead a space that is frequently contested with our choices between good and evil. St Ignatius of Loyola clearly identified this in his spiritual practice of discernment of spirits. He noted that the devil comes to us especially in our good deeds, cloaked as an angel of light. We enter these six weeks of Lent within the backdrop of this desert scene. It is in this context that we experience a heightened sensitivity in discerning the subtle ways in which spirits of light and darkness compete for the holy ground of our hearts. We ask that we may have the clarity and strength of Jesus to remain faithful to choosing all that is anchored in and springs forth from the source of the true light.



FINANCE UPDATE – SIX MONTHS TO 31 DECEMBER 2024

THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY IN TIME, TALENT AND TREASURE

Dear Parishioners

We are very pleased that over the last six months the renovation of the presbytery was completed as well as the interim office accommodation. Also, the mould was removed from the hall, and the hall was given a freshen up. Dehumidifiers have now been installed in the hall to prevent any new build up of mould.

Our priests moved back into the presbytery at the beginning of December. We sincerely thank those parishioners who assisted with the clearing out of the old office and those who assisted in moving the priests into the renovated presbytery as well as those who assisted with the office move.

We also thank all those who contributed to this project for their generosity. As mentioned in a recent Parish bulletin we have ceased fund raising for the overall project other than a few PC items that have not yet been covered. There are still some expenses to be incurred, primarily for adding extra shelving and storage in the office. The office also needs a new photocopier as the current photocopier is quite old and prone to break downs. It is estimated that the new shelving and storage will cost around \$4,500 and the new photocopier around \$8,000.

The containers that have been taking up car spaces will soon be moved. We will need to retain one container and will be purchasing rather than renting it. This is to store the hall tables and chairs as well as some of the Parish documents and files that do not fit in the current office. A second hand refurbished container will cost around \$3,900. It can be sold if it is no longer required.

Our fund-raising efforts now are mainly addressed at covering the expenses noted above and meeting our quota for the Pastoral Works Fund. The amount we need to raise, as levied by the Diocese, is \$29,684. So far we have raised \$14,590. Please remember that donations to the Pastoral Works Fund are tax deductible and tax receipts are issued. Donations can be made online on the Diocese of Broken Bay website (indicating that your Parish is St Ives), in the envelopes provided at the back of the Church or directly into the Church bank account, indicating that it is for the Pastora-I Works Fund. The majority of the money raised for the Pastoral Works Fund goes to the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) that provides the resources to our catechists.

At the December PFC meeting Kit Ling Chow resigned from the PFC. We thank her for her contribution over the last few years and for arranging all our fund-raising events. We do now have a vacancy on the PFC for someone who would like to take on the fund-raising role. Can you please let the office know if you would be able to take on this role. Another resignation was that of Paul Gavazzi. We thank Paul for his contribution to the PFC, particularly as a member of the building sub-committee. His advice and counsel was really appreciated.

Our operating income for the six months is down by around 5% over the same period last year and our operating expenses are up by just under 10% over the corresponding period last year. We are still running at an operating deficit and are doing what we can to reduce our expenditure.

With the demise of Catholic Church Insurance (now under administration) a new insurer had to be found. The Diocese has chosen AON as the new insurer for the Diocese. Unfortunately our insurance premium will increase and is now \$38,716 per annum, a significant increase on last year. This additional cost is not reflected in the half yearly accounts as the premium was only given to us recently. We had budgeted on an increase in premium to \$29,000 so this will impact our deficit. We welcome all new parishioners and encourage those who haven't yet joined the planned giving to participate by way of a direct debit or credit card. If you haven't yet but would like to contribute by direct debit or credit card please call the Parish Office (9144 6998) or complete the form that can be found at the back of the Church and return it to the office or drop it in the second collection bag at the front of the church.

We thank all parishioners for their continued support as we all work together during these challenging times to enhance our Parish.

The Word Sunday 9 March 2025: First Sunday of Lent

Collect

Grant, almighty God, through the yearly observances of holy Lent, that we may grow in understanding of the riches hidden in Christ and by worthy conduct pursue their effects. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

From the book of Deuteronomy Dt 26:4-10

The confession of faith of the elect.

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement: "My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, Lord, have given me." Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus was led by the Spirit through the wilderness where he was tempted. Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.' Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.' Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God', he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says: He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you, and again: They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.' But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.' Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.
